
Welcome back to school



Universal Infant Free School Meals

There appears to be some confusion about whether children in FS2, Year 1 and Year 2 who are all entitled to a free school meal as part of the universal Infant free school meal scheme will get the weekly £15 vouchers the government are giving to free school meal children. It is important to understand that these vouchers are for children whose parents have claimed for free school meals through the benefits agency. You can qualify for the following reasons:

- Income support
- Income based job seekers allowance
- Income related employment and support allowance
- Pension credits
- Child tax credit and a gross annual income that does not exceed £16,190. You will not qualify for free school meals if you receive working tax credit
- Asylum Seeker status

Infant children are still entitled to order a grab bag to be collected from the school kitchen. If you think that you are entitled to free school meals, you can still apply at the following website. https://www.rotherham.gov.uk/benefits/apply-free-school-meals/1
