#### Dear parents/carers,

As you are all now aware, the government has asked primary schools to plan for children in F1, F2, Y1 and Y6 to return to school from 1st June.

I want to keep you as fully informed as possible, but must emphasise that opening of school is conditional on the continued decline of deaths and infections. In all our planning, school leaders will put the safety of children, staff and the wider community of Wath first and foremost. When school returns, it will be a totally different environment to the one we are all used to. Children will work, play and eat in a self-contained bubble of no more than 15 which will be staffed consistently by the same adults. Each bubble will have a designated classroom, toilets, entrances and play areas. Parents will drop off and pick up at the school gate at a given time, times will be staggered to minimise social interaction. The school day will be different for each group of children.

All parents with children in F1, F2, Y1 and Y6 have now been contacted to establish the numbers of children who want to return to school. Leaders will look at the numbers of key worker children, how many F1, F2, Y1 and Y6 children would return and how many staff are available. Key worker children will be a priority group; there are two bubbles of these children in school already. It might be that we do not have the available space or staff to have all the designated classes return to school. Not all additional groups of children will start on 1st June; groups will be phased to allow children and staff become accustomed to new routines.

Home school learning will continue for all year groups; it may be that a member of staff adult, other than your child's class teacher responds to emails etc. The children in school will follow what children at home are studying.

As part of the planning process, we have consulted with our family of Catholic schools and James Montgomery Academy Trust, our local MAT. We have looked at how other countries are reopening their schools to learn from their experience. Our plan will be based on all this information and any further advice from the government and the Local Authority. Governors will discuss and approve the plan next Wednesday and we will share it with the whole school community on Thursday 21st May.

Thank you for your continued support. It is essential that we work together to keep all the members of our school community safe and well.

## FQAs

### Q1: Will my child be safe in school?

Q2: When will Y2, Y3, Y4 and Y5 return to school? The government hasn't given any further guidance on when these year groups could attend school but it will be dependent on many factors. If all classes return to school, it will be on a part time basis.

### Q3: Will home school learning continue?

Yes, home school learning will continue for all year groups, although slight adaptations may need to be made if teachers are working in school full time.

**Q4:** My child has been attending school regularly since lockdown, will they be able to continue to attend? Yes, your children can continue to attend school.

**Q5: What arrangements are being made for Y6 transition?** Secondary schools will be in contact about Y6 transition.

Q6: I have been asked to return to work but my child isn't in F1, F2, Y1 or Y6. Can they come to school? No, your child cannot come to school unless they are in the designated classes.

**Q7:** If I have a child in F1, F2, Y1 or Y6, can their siblings who are not in these classes come to school as well? No, siblings cannot come unless they are in F1, F2, Y1 or Y6.

Q8: I am a key worker but haven't sent my children to school during the lockdown. If I return to work but my child isn't in F1, F2, Y1 or Y6, can I now send my child to school ? Please check the following guidance for who is classes as a key worker




