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## **COVID** update

#### Re: Recent Covid-19 UK Health Security Agency update

#### Children with Covid-19

Children and young people with COVID-19 should not attend their education setting while they are infectious. They should take an LFD test from 5 days after their symptoms started (or the day their test was taken if they did not have symptoms) followed by another one the next day. If both these test results are negative, they should return to their educational setting, as long as they feel well enough to do so and do not have a temperature.

## Living with someone who has Covid-19 and close contacts

Children and young people who are asymptomatic but, live with someone who has COVID-19 should continue to attend their educational setting as normal.

As a school we will continue to focus our Covid-19 risk assessment on the Governments four control areas:

- Ensure good hygiene for everyone.
- Maintain appropriate cleaning regimes.
- Keep occupied spaces well ventilated.
- Continue to follow public health advice on testing, self-isolation and managing confirmed cases of COVID-19.

## F2/Y6 Palm Sunday Assembly

F2 and Y6 will lead our Palm Sunday Assembly on Monday 4<sup>th</sup> April at 2.30pm. We warmly invite parents/carers of F2/Y6 children to attend.

This will be our first invitation to an indoor event for parents/carers since the start of the pandemic is a first step in our plan to move forward safely. We ask that families limit attendance to 2 adults per child and that parents/carers text school to confirm their attendance so that we can plan accurately. Adults should not attend on the day if they are experiencing any COVID symptoms or have tested positive within the last five days of the date.

Masks are not required but you may choose to wear one. Please note that in the event of an outbreak in school or a rise in infection rate, we may have to cancel attendance.

#### **Uniform**

Children should wear full school uniform every day except on Forest School and PE days when outdoor PE kit should be worn.

School uniform is black or grey trousers/skirt/shorts (not leggings), white polo shirt and royal blue jumper/cardigan/sweatshirt, black or grey socks or tights and plain black shoes or trainers. Please note that boots are not appropriate for the summer term and children should wear black shoes or trainers.

Outdoor PE kit is black or navy tracksuit bottoms, plain white teeshirt and royal blue jumper/cardigan/sweatshirt. Children may choose to wear royal blue Forest School badged tops on Forest School/PE days only.

Long hair should be fastened back. No jewellery, nail polish or make up should be worn with the exception of one pair of small stud earrings and a watch (not smartwatch) or fitbit. Children must be able to remove earrings themselves for PE.
