Uniform

Year 1 - Year 6

Everyday School Uniform:

White polo shirt

Grey or black tailored trousers/shorts, skirt or pinafore dress – leggings should not be worn Royal blue school sweatshirt or cardigan with or without school logo

Black shoes or plain black trainers with black soles – boots should not be worn for school. A blue and white checked gingham dress/shorts can be worn for summer.

PE and Forest School Uniform:

Royal blue polo shirt

Royal blue hoodie with or without school/forest school logo

Black only shorts/jogging bottoms/sports leggings

Royal blue hoodies, with or without Forest School logo, should

only be worn on PE days and Outdoor Friday

Trainers – do not have to be black for PE/Forest School

Foundation Stage

FS children can choose to wear black tracksuit bottoms and royal blue polo shirt every day. Royal blue hoodies, with or without Forest School logo, should only be worn on PE days and Outdoor Friday

All children should have a pair of wellies in school

Children must not wear jewellery, nail varnish or make-up in school with the exception of one small pair of plain earring studs or single stud in pierced ears, watches or fitbits — no smartwatches. All earrings must be removed for PE and cannot be covered with plasters. All long hair must be tied back. Children should not have extreme haircuts, styles or accessories that could serve as a distraction to themselves and/or the other children. Summer uniform should be worn from the beginning of the summer term until the half term of the autumn term.

Please inform school if for any reason your child is not able to wear uniform on a particular day. Parents/carers will be sent text reminders if children are not in correct uniform.
